

Lures

In February 2015 the Board of Greyhound Racing Victoria (GRV) resolved that only artificial materials are permitted for use as a lure for the purpose of training a greyhound.

'Lure' means any item, natural or man-made, that is used in any way, by any person with the intention (or the effect) of encouraging or inciting a greyhound to pursue/chase, attack/bite onto, or excite by responding to such stimuli. This includes all types of lures, including those attached to an arm, dragged lures, squealers, and any other item used to excite a greyhound or get it to chase.

This GRV Board policy means that any lures, used at any stage of training (not just race training or at trial tracks), must be fully made of synthetic material and should not contain any animal product, part of an animal, or skin/hide, whether treated (tanned) or not.
